We have had a whirlwind of worship over the last few months. Between Lent and Easter, followed by the

Easter Season, Pentecost, and Trinity Sunday we have just come out of one of the busiest worship seasons of the year.

And as we approach summer which has less 'major' Christian holidays, it is important for us to sit back and reflect on what God has done for us. Starting with the Christian New Year last Advent we eagerly awaited Jesus' birth as a little baby: God made Human, the Christmas event, so that he could save us. 
## Annual Catered Dinner



Tom Whitaker, Laura Barmore and Jill Webb will serve as emergency contacts during Pastor David's vacation from June 2nd to 16th.

Briana Lawhorne will serve as the new Nursery Coordinator.

Five youth have expressed interest in attending the Middle School Conference at Massanetta Springs.

Pastor David, as a member of the Presbytery's Committee on Preparation for the Ministry, has been asked to look into guidelines for Sessions of churches with prospective ministers. He has also been trained to be a liaison for churches in transition between ministers and will participate in Riverheads High School's Baccalaureate service.

The new Outreach and Evangelism Committee needs two more members in order to begin their work. Please consider joining this opportunity to help Bethel in its ministry.

The funds received from the payoff of the Thornton note will be placed in the money market account in order to earn interest and remain available. The bequest from Jessie Earhart will be placed in the Endowment Fund to be invested, with 20% of its earnings to be reinvested and 80% to be deposited in the General Fund.

The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Committee has received two bids for an audio/visual system for the Sanctuary, one of which was for \$23,500. The cost of installing air conditioning in the Fellowship Hall and Youth Room will be at least \$26,000.

The names of our missionaries, Michael and Rachel Weller, will now be put in the Staff and Leaders section of the Bulletin.

#### Pastor Relations Committee Message

This month we recognize the 2 year anniversary of Reverend Shearer's ordination, a remarkable achievement after many years of study and preparation. The Pastor Nomination Committee witnessed his successful examination and sermon at a meeting of the Presbytery, and were among the first to address him as Reverend Shearer after his ordination at Bethel on May 25th, 2014.



In our study of scripture, we are taught the extraordinary story of David and Goliath, where we remember the fierce hurdles and troubles David faced when he found himself standing alone with Goliath. David knew before the battle that his only certainty was that he held the favor of God. Even though Pastor David has not had to face Goliath, he has had to face his own hurdles and troubles. His challenges have been many. David's victory in the Bible is comparable to Reverend Shearer's success at Bethel

When we met David 2 years ago in Salisbury MD, sitting in his grandmother's house, we all shared an instant bond. During our conversation with him, we experienced first-hand a young man who had the favor of God, as David did in the Bible. We also saw a man who was eager and willing to face a new day, a new challenge, with a new family. We found Pastor David to be a man of God devoted to the ministry who loved first and spoke second. These attributes are remarkably similar to the beautiful story we all love and cherish in scripture.


