- •There will be a Congregational Meeting today, following the worship service for the purpose of hearing the report of the Church Nominating Committee and electing new Church Officers.





All assessments are due by 5pm on December 11th. Completed paper assessments should be enclosed in the original envelope and deposited in the CAT box outside the church office.


