

---- Music Notes: Sunday, September 3rd ----

Today's anthem covers a multitude of Biblical stories—Adam and Eve, Psalm 138, The Prodigal Son, the Second Coming, the tribulation, and other passages from Revelation.

Here's the first verse:

The love of God is greater far than tongue or pen can ever tell; It goes beyond the highest star, and reaches to the lowest hell. The guilty pair, bowed down with care, God gave His Son to win; His erring child He reconciled, and pardoned from his sin.

The Second verse:

When years of time shall pass away, and earthly thrones and kingdoms fall, When men, who here refuse to pray, On rocks and hills and mountains call, God's love so sure, shall still endure, all measureless and strong: Redeeming grace to Adam's race—the saints' and angels' song.

The Third verse (and the best of all)

Could we with ink the ocean fill, and were the skies of parchment made, Were every stalk on earth a quill and every man a scribe by trade, To write the love of God above would drain the ocean dry. Nor could the scroll contain the whole, though stretched from sky to sky.

Frederick Lehman penned hundreds of hymns and songs, contained in 11 books, most with music by his daughter. His lineage is Mennonite and his religious affiliation was Nazarene, derived somewhat from Wesleyan theology, which was greatly influenced by the Mennonite theology. Lehman was the founder of the Nazarene publishing house in 1917 and wrote most of his hymns to accompany his sermons.


