God of mercy, we begin this Lenten season in confession. We do not live according to your ways, but according to our own. We condone violence, participate in systems of injustice, and use



Frances Ridley Havergal, writer of today's anthem text, was born in Worchester England, the daughter of an Anglican minister. Her scholastic achievements included several modern languages together with Greek and Hebrew. She does not occupy, and did not claim for herself a prominent place as a poet, but by her distinct individuality she carved out a niche which she alone could fill. Simply and sweetly she sang the love of God through her hymns. Her religious views and theological bias are distinctly set forth in her poems, and may be described as mildly Calvinistic, without the severe dogmatic tenet of reprobation. Today's anthem has been published in 464 hymnals of various denominations. It simply states the things Christ gave up for us and asks us what we have done for Him.
