

The Session's View . . .

As most of you know, I volunteer at Kingsway Help Center, a food pantry and clothes closet located nearby in Spottswood. It is a local, grass-roots organization that benefits the neediest members of our community. There is a base group of about twelve people who do most of the work necessary to keep Kingsway running: helping clients sign up for services, sorting and displaying donated goods and food, ordering food, picking food up at the food bank, unloading, storing and disbursing food, handling the finances and preparing inventories and reports.



The Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, with which Kingsway is affiliated, calls us a "faith-based" organization. Yes, we have selections of Scripture displayed on our walls, such as: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." (Hebrews 13:2) We also have devotions at the beginning of each day when we distribute food. However, Kingsway differs from other groups that the food bank designates as "faith-based" in that we are not from a single church or religious organization. We are members of Bethel, Vesuvius Baptist, Old Providence Presbyterian, Redeemer Lutheran and others.

So, what makes this diverse group of people "faith-based"? It is our belief in God and our desire to follow Jesus' teachings, which is strengthened by our participation in our home churches. Having Jesus in our hearts causes us to care for those who need help and makes us work to provide them with food, clothing and household goods. But, we could not exist without a huge "faith-based" network of people who also share our beliefs. When you, members of Bethel, donate to Kingsway, or any other such organization, it is evidence of your belief and faith in God and your desire to help others. "And don't forget to do good and to share with those in need. These are the sacrifices that please God." (Hebrews 13:16)




Church Office Closed Easter Monday



The Bethel Presbyterian Church Continuing Education Loan Fund (formerly the Scholarship/Loan Fund) was established a number of years ago due to the gener-



Bethel Historical Documents on Display



John and Wallace Pilson have donated two historical items to Bethel. The documents were passed down to them from their ancestor, Matthew Pilson, who served as an elder at Bethel from 1804 to 1822. One document is Matthew Pilson's personal recollection of Bethel's origin: our separation from Brown's Meeting House. The other is a ledger which contains the handwritten records of two early Bethel organi-

zations: the Bethel Temperance Society and the Committee of Bethel Library. The Temperance Society records begin with the formation of the Society on December 26, 1831 and continue through January 14, 1838. They were written by Matthew Pilson, who was the secretary of the Society. The Library section of the ledger is a record of the minutes of the Committee's meetings and detail the formation of the library on August 8, 1846, continue through August 29, 1863 and were also written by Matthew Pilson. We at Bethel are extremely grateful to John and Wallace Pilson for these gifts. They are a priceless addition to our collection of historical artifacts and also to our knowledge of Bethel's history. Our heartfelt thanks are extended to the Pilsons for their generosity. <u>These items will be on display in Memorial Hall, before and after worship, on Easter Sunday, April 1st</u>.





