

==== Guest Musician for Sunday, May 27th =====

Our guest trumpeter, Sarah Kay Biser, is a graduate of Riverheads High School where she played in the concert, jazz and marching bands and was drum major of the marching band, winning "best drum major" honors at several marching competitions. While at Riverheads she auditioned for and was selected to the Augusta County Honors Band, the Virginia Tech Honors Band, The District 5 Virginia Band Directors Association Honor band, The Virginia Music Educators All-Virginia Honor Band and All Virginia Orchestra. Also, while in high school she studied piano with Kathy Lafon in Staunton and Jim Kluesner, professor of trumpet emeritus at JMU. She joined the Stonewall Brigade her sophomore year alongside of a trumpeter retired from the marine band, an attorney who plays in several big bands in northern Virginia, and a retired pastor who played in big bands throughout his ministry. Sarah Kay was playing first trumpet and being assigned solos in band selections by the end of that year. On Mondays starting with her junior year after she had her driver's license, she left school, drove 10 miles to northern Staunton for her piano lesson, then to Harrisonburg for her trumpet lesson, then back 25 miles to Staunton for the Stonewall Brigade Band rehearsal at 8 pm and then home at 9:30 to finish studying for Governors' School. This year she just finished her freshman year as a trumpet performance major at Christopher Newport University where she is in the marching, pep, jazz bands and the concert wind ensemble. This summer she is again working in her dad's business in Stuarts Draft—White Hill Catering, BBO, and restaurant. Her mom was active as an officer in the Riverheads Band Boosters and is reading specialist in the central office for the Augusta County Schools.
