



NEWS & NOTES The Session met on Sunday, April 8th, with eleven elders and the moderator, Pastor Joe Condro, present.

The primary purpose of this meeting was to discuss and plan a new direction for Bethel's youth program. Derek Almarode, elder and chairman of the Youth Committee, outlined his vision and goals for how to implement a new approach and activities which will improve our program. All Session members agreed that our youth are a priority and that we support new ideas which will enhance our children's experience and fellowship at Bethel.

The Session approved a two-part plan:

- 1. To develop and implement a youth protection policy
- 2. To make funding available to hire a 3/4-time Youth Director at a date to be determined

Until a director is hired, the Youth Committee will develop new activities and continue current programs and will support the director after he or she is hired.
