# Greetings from the Pastor's Desk . . .

Generosity is often described as a virtue and embodied by the practice of giving gifts. A generous person can be described as one who does not hold tremendous value in material possessions and feels "free" to give lavishly. Generosity is held in high esteem by many world religions, including Christianity. What is more many religious leaders, researchers, and doctors agree that "generosity" is actually good for you.\*



This word has much meaning packed into its five syllables. Generosity through giving is a mark of Christian commitment and discipleship. Over 2000 scriptures in the Bible call our attention to "giving" in time, talent, and treasure. Giving Today, an online resource states, "The Bible speaks more about the topic of generosity than faith and prayer combined!" No one would argue that Christians are called to the discipleship of generosity. Remembering "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him won't perish but will have eternal life" (John 3:16) sets a model that generosity in God's people should be sacrificial. However, this model is a daily challenge, because of our propensity to "store up" our time, talent, and especially our treasure for ourselves. This daily walk is self-denying adventure and takes an intentional commitment to be in relationship with the triune God. Our desires will always challenge us in these areas, so being honest and reflective about this is paramount. If we claim God's generous gift in Christ Jesus, then we accept the invitation to continually wonder and re-imagine our Christian call to proclaim the "Good News" of the Gospel sacrificially through our time, talent, and treasure.

In the coming months, Bethel's Stewardship and Finance committee will be devoted to creating the 2019 Budget. As they engage in this important task, I ask for your prayers for both the committee and for the congregation. If we claim to represent Christ in the world, we open ourselves to reflecting on God's provision in our lives. I invite us to wonder and reimagine this commitment by asking these questions; are we sharing our time generously? Are we sharing our "God-given" talents generously? Are we sharing our treasure generously? God promises to meet us where we are, on the journey of giving, and expects us to react. Such outward response is the discipleship of generosity lived out and will reach out into the world beyond anything we can imagine!

Bethel, "generosity is actually good for you!" So, let us consider how we might unbridle our generosity this coming year and then watch what God can do by the power of the living Spirit, in the life of Bethel, in our community, and in the greater world to glorify "the 'Name" above all names," Jesus Christ our Lord.


