Thank you for your support of this project! •Bethel welcomes Chaplain (Captain) Clifton Edwards who will be our guest speaker this morning. Chaplain Edwards grew up in Greenville, VA and was confirmed in Bethel Presbyterian Church. He was a member of Boy Scout Troop 13 where he earned the rank of Eagle Scout. He graduated from Riverheads High School in 1995 as co-valedictorian. He graduated from the College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia, in 1999, where he earned a Bachelor of Science, magna cum laude, in Biology. He earned a Master of Divinity in Apologetics in 2007, from the Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary at Wake Forest, North Carolina, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Divinity in 2011 from St Mary's College, University of St Andrews in Scotland, where his research focused on theological aesthetics and epistemology. Chaplain Edwards has taught at the University of St Andrews and at Hawaii Pacific University. He was a medical support assistant at Tripler Army Medical Center Emergency Department from 2011-13.

Chaplain Edwards was a cadet in the College of William and Mary Revolutionary Guard Battalion. He was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Army Medical Service Corps and graduated from the Army Medical Department Officer Basic Course, Ft. Sam Houston, Texas. He has worked in several leadership rolls in the US Army and was recommissioned as a Chaplain (Captain) and completed the Chaplain Officer Basic Leadership Course at Ft. Jackson, South Carolina in 2013. He served as the Battalion Chaplain for the 303<sup>rd</sup> Ordnance Battalion (EOD), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, from 2013-16. He completed four units of Clinical Pastoral Education at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center from 2016-17. He is now a chaplain clinician at Walter Reed, working with wounded warriors, traumatic brain injury patients, and psychiatric inpatients.

Chaplain Edwards' is the author of 11 scholarly and popular publications, including *Creation's Beauty as Revelation: Toward a Creational Theology of Natural Beauty*, Wipf and Stock, 2014; "Theology from Outside the Foxhole: A Veteran Reflects on Heroism," *Practical Theology* 6 (2013); and "Artful Creation and Aesthetic Rationality: Toward a Creational Theology of Revelatory Beauty," *Theology Today* 69 (2012). His theological research has been published in Britain, Ireland, and the United States and is available at <u>http://cliftonedwards.wordpress.com</u>.

#### Update on the location of Riverheads WRE . . .

The following is a letter from Mary Alford who will be speaking briefly during the worship service next Sunday, November 18th, about WRE.

# To our valued WRE supporters,

We are excited to tell you about the progress being made with Riverheads Weekday Religious Education! As many of you know, the new Riverheads Elementary School is in its second year at the new location. Since the old school closed, we have been unable to offer WRE because we have not had an appropriate location. Now the ball is finally rolling! Easements have been approved by the school board, the contract has been signed by the landowner, and closing is expected by mid-November! Below is a picture of the lot (notice Riverheads Elm. in the background) and a rough sketch of the building. We are ready to enlist your help! We are estimating the cost of the lot, hook-up to public water and septic, driveway, permits, materials and labor to cost approximately \$250,000. We currently have just over \$130,000 in our building fund. Several churches and individuals have said they planned to make donations once we had a definite plan in place, now is the time! Some churches have suggested that each church do a fundraiser or take up a special offering. Donations can be sent to: Riverheads WRE; PO Box 352; Greenville, VA 24440.
