

Greetings from the Pastor's Desk . . .

Wait on the Lord...

Last week a close Christian friend said indignantly, "I do not like Christmas anymore!" I understood her mindset. The anxiety and demands of the holiday are immense and I find myself overwhelmed by the "must dos" of the season rather than peacefully waiting the profound gift and mystery of the birth of Jesus Christ. Why? The observance of the birth of our Savior has been overtaken by consumer wants and corporate profits. The "C" (Christ) is literally taken out of Christmas, leaving us empty, exhausted, and economically depleted after the manger is gifted with Life.



Inserting "Christ" back into Christmas where "secular Christmas" has bombarded our living rooms, our kitchens, and even our churches will not be an easy task. We live in a culture that is mesmerized by the glitz of the season. Christmas decorations are out by October, children, and adults alike are making wish lists for Santa Claus, we decorate religiously, and bake incessantly. The pressure of the consumer culture bears down on us; buying into it just seems easier. Some of us may choose not to budge until after Thanksgiving, only to find ourselves in a stressed out mania, trying to get it all done before the BIG day. We quickly find ourselves far from Christ, acting like a consumer "nut-so," dragged around by the need to please and the prevailing consumer culture. This mentality makes it very difficult for us to recover the theological riches of Advent and Christmas from the tradition, but we should prayerfully and deliberately try.

One way we can do this is to fully engage the Advent season, a specific time to reflect and anticipate the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ. During Advent, while we buy, wrap, and stuff the space under our trees, it is important to remember that although "God" is at work, the manger is empty! As Christians, we have an opportunity to observe and live into the Advent of Christ. This Holy time is to be set aside to expectantly WAIT for and prepare for the arrival of God incarnate in Jesus of Nazareth. However, waiting has become less and less fashionable in our impatient age.

Nonetheless, we are called on to "Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!" (Psalm 27:14) This simple and profound verse is a beautiful starting point to be a mindful Christian in a consumer culture that surrounds Christmas and essentially every day of our lives.

Advent has the potential to combat the flagrant consumerism surrounding Christmas. By fully engaging in the practice of Advent, we can revitalize the "spiritual" Christmas of our faith, quenching our "seasonally" parched souls to be better prepared for all Christmas truly means when it finally arrives.

Expectantly waiting for the gift of the Christ Child can also promote waiting in other areas of our lives. God's provision is said to be right and good; we do not have to succumb to the power and idolatry of consumerism in our lives. The more we acknowledge our need for a Savior, the more we can remove ourselves from the prey of the "dollar" and self imposed demands of the holiday to REJOICE fully when He is finally swaddled in the manger.

It is vital to remember we are dependent on God in all things, and to observe the traditions of our Christianity, while being mindful of a world that seeks to distract us from the true meaning of Christmas. Advent is a beautiful way to focus on the wonderment and anticipation of the birth of the Christ Child and the hope, peace, joy, and love that is offered by a generous and loving God. He is coming, now let's wait...

Candles of Advent

During the four Sundays of Advent, Bethel will be illuminated with candles as we light our Advent wreath of evergreen, shaped in a perfect circle to symbolize God's eternity. Advent means "coming," and during the season, we prepare for the coming of the Christ child.



The four Sundays preceding Christmas, which is when Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, are recognized for four virtues. The candles on the Advent wreath symbolize hope, peace, joy and love. The candles are lit in that order, beginning on December 2nd, the first Sunday of Advent. The fifth and final candle is the Christ candle which will be lit on Christmas Eve to remind us of the light Jesus Christ brings to the world.



The Session met on November 13, 2018 with 8 elders and the moderator, Pastor Kelly-Ann Rayle, present.

Pastor Kelly-Ann and the Christian Education Committee will offer a church-wide Advent study, "God is in the Manger." Those who choose to participate will use a study guide during the Advent season. Then, they will attend a luncheon after worship on January 6th, 2019 to discuss what they have learned.

Confirmation of Faith Program

This year Pastor Kelly-Ann, along with other adult volunteers will welcome all youth grades 7-12 to participate in this year's confirmation program. The program will serve as an overview of the Christian faith, church, and life to prepare our youth to consider and make their own personal commitments of faith.



The youth will participate in an Adult guided confirmation class during the Sunday School hour beginning January 6th, 2019 and will continue through March ending with an overnight faith review retreat (TBA). In addition, the youth will be matched with an elder in the church with whom they can explore the nature of Christian discipleship. The program culminates with an invitation to youth to personally profess faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and be commissioned as a disciple. This will take place at an April meeting with the Bethel Session and in a worship service on the first Sunday of May.

Youth Christian Education Opportunities

Bethel seeks to provide a welcoming youth ministry that nurtures a strong sense of community with others, where each individual is valued and nurtured, and all are accepted as God's unique creations. Our offerings seek to enable young people to understand and recognize who Jesus is, and what it means to live for him. 
