

Adult Christian Education Opportunities

<u>The Women of the Church (Presbyterian Women)</u> The PWCT meets the first Sunday of each month following the worship service. They meet to discuss programs, service projects, and outreach organized by the Women of the Church. They have a Chairperson for each area of focus; Spiritual Growth, Community Outreach, World Outreach, and Together in Service. Youth Ministries and Christian Education Programs

Bethel seeks to provide a welcoming youth ministry that nurtures a strong sense of community with others, where each individual is valued and nurtured, and all are accepted as God's unique creations. Our offerings seek to enable young people to understand and recognize Jesus, and what it means to live for him. This is accomplished in CHRISTIAN numerous ways, providing youth with many opportunities for spiritual and personal EDUCATION growth. We are blessed at Bethel to have a committed group of adult volunteers dedicated to working with our youth and encouraging them in their walk of faith. Youth gatherings will take place throughout the year, September through June, with many opportunities for learning, fellowship, and service.

Sunday School

Youth (Pre-K-6th grade)

This class meets downstairs in the Christian Education wing and discusses a variety of topics, focusing on building a foundation and knowledge of the Bible for children. There are stories, crafts, and activities each week. The class is taught by Donna Bush.

Youth Bible Study

The Bethel Youth meet for lunch, Bible study, and discussion on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. The Youth Committee organizes and facilitates this activity.

Youth Fellowship/Mission Activity

The Bethel Youth meet on the 2nd Sunday of each month for fellowship and/or a mission activity. The location and time varies depending on the activity. The Youth Committee organizes and facilitates this activity.



Confirmation of Faith Program

This year, Pastor Kelly-Ann, along with other adult volunteers, will wel-BIG QUESTIONS come all youth grades 7-12 to participate in this year's confirmation pro-CONFIRMATION FOR A GROWING FAITH gram. The program will serve as an overview of the Christian faith,

church, and life to prepare our youth to make their own personal commitments of faith.

The youth will participate in an adult-guided confirmation class during the Sunday School hour, beginning January 6th, and continuing through March, ending with an overnight faith review retreat (TBA). In addition, the youth will be matched with an elder in the church with whom they can explore the nature of Christian discipleship. The program culminates with an invitation to the youth to personally profess faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and be commissioned as a disciple. This will take place at an April meeting with the Bethel Session and in a worship service on the first Sunday of May.

Boy Scouts

The Boy Scouts meet throughout the year on Monday evenings at 7:00 pm in the Bethel Scout Hut. The Scouts also attend and assist with special worship services, church events, and community events. Camping and other outdoor activities are scheduled throughout the year. John Davis is the contact person for Boy Scout Troop 13.


