

From the Pastor's Desk . . .

ONE BODY IN CHRIST

There is one body, but it has many parts all its many parts make up one body. It is the same with Christ. We were all baptized by one Holy Spirit. And so we are formed into one body. You are the body of Christ. Each one of you is a part of it. 1 Cor.12:12-13, 27

In July of 2011, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) implemented a new, welcomed Form of Government for the purpose of instilling greater freedom and flexibility to the churches, and encouraging congregations and councils to focus on God's mission. It offers a



structure that is more horizontal than hierarchical. It encourages the church to be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit as it seeks to be Christ's body and to live out its calling as a community of faith, hope, love and witness.

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is steadfast in its claim that Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church and its councils. The councils of our church are made up of presbyters who are ruling elders and teaching elders that serve on sessions, presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly. This month, it is with tremendous gratitude and joy that I highlight the council of the Presbytery and Bethel's Presbytery of care: The Shenandoah Presbytery.

The Presbytery serves as a corporate expression of the church. It has specific responsibilities that fall into three general categories: those relating to congregations, those relating to ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and those relating to synod and the General Assembly. It includes all the churches and ministers of the Word and Sacrament within a certain district. Just as the session of elected ruling elders shall not "lord over" a congregation, the Presbytery does not seek to "lord over" the congregations or its ministers. On the contrary, its aim is to be a supportive and visionary partner in fidelity to the Word of God and to strengthen and nurture the faith and life of the church.

The Shenandoah Presbytery not only has specific responsibilities to the church, but has a specific vision to be a covenant body where:

- Congregations are empowered to be centers for mission,
- People of God are equipped to be Disciples of Christ in a challenging world,
- Church leaders and members are nurtured and strengthened for service,
- Open communication and information are used constructively and creatively to keep us connected.
- Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church and its councils.
- The councils of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) are comprised of presbyters; ruling elders and teaching elders that serve on sessions, presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly.

This is an inspiring and purpose FILLED vision and as your Stated Supply Pastor, I encourage the Bethel Congregation to support the Presbytery's work, mission, and vision for ALL the churches that make up the Shenandoah Presbytery.

One way we can do this is to host the Presbytery for its quarterly meetings. In October 2018, the session of Bethel voted to host the 181st Stated Meeting of the Presbytery on February 23, 2019. Over 180 church folk, made up of ministers, ruling elders, commissioned ruling elders, Bethel congregation members and youth members gathered to worship, fellowship, and conduct the business and mission of the church.

This historical event was planned and headed up by the amazing efforts of Kathy Swisher and the Bethel Youth. Along with them, many volunteers worked countless hours to make this day a reality. I am humbled and deeply grateful for their tireless efforts to bring forth a hospitable setting, a meaningful worship service, a structured and timely meeting, and wonderful lunch service. Bethel, please join me in lifting up, in gratitude, the gracious and valiant efforts of our TEAM...




<u>Biography - Rev. Brad Langdon</u>


Bill Brubeck

Katie Miller


