

From the Pastor's Desk . . .

A "Good Friday" Message ... John 19:1-37

This month we will encounter another "Good Friday" and each year I seem to ask myself the same question - What is so "good" about the holiest of men being falsely accused, beaten, and nailed to a cross?

The narrative in the Gospel of John clearly spells out the harsh reality of the pain inflicted on the flesh of Jesus. The word choices alone trigger our angst and sorrow. "Flogged" or "scourged", depending on the translation, and "crucify," the most horrific death known to the times, all evoke feelings of shock and sadness. It is evident with a close reading of the text that brokenness and related sin cause much pain, conflict, fear, destruction, and yes, even death. I cannot help but ponder how utterly cruel human beings can be!!!



Can any "good" be found in the midst of this narrative of violence and despair? To answer this question, I am immediately reminded of my Catholic upbringing. All the crosses around my Portuguese family homes displayed the Crucifixion, including one in every room at my great-grandmother's! I still have the cross from my great-grandfather's funeral over the main door of my Crozet home. My Catholic family taught me that Jesus' death was certainly a horrific tragedy, but that as tragic as it was, the death, in fact, dawned His glory in God's sacrifice.

As I sit with John's take on the events of Good Friday I can see this image in words. John clearly points to our human atrocities. For example, Judas selling Jesus out, Pilate's lack of a backbone to do the right thing, the Jewish officials, so determined to stay focused on the law that they could not "see" God, and let's not forget Jesus' own disciple, Peter, betraying Him not once but three painful times.

But even still and with the worst of our human condition hovering over the day - our generous God gave His Son the words that would witness to God's sovereignty and generous care in the midst of evil. The "Good" softly scented the air as Jesus pointed out the "beloved" disciple and his mother to care for each other. Then the "GOOD" echoed on high as Jesus said, "It is finished!"

The Gospel of John's gift to Holy Week is that Good Friday is good because it reveals a loving reconciling God who is sovereign over us, in every detail, and in every moment! The Friday before Easter is "Good" because the truth and grace given by God in Christ Jesus becomes completely fulfilled. God's generous and providential sovereignty reigns as the kingdom "now" seems wrought by our broken and sometimes despicable ways. The kingdom "come" becomes ushered in by the final and ultimate sacrifice, Jesus Christ the Son of God - the ultimate GOOD news!

Let us pray....

Lord, Author and Captain of our lives...

Help us to sit at the foot of the cross and ponder your gift to humanity. Help us to see Your "Good" amidst the tragedy of the crucifixion. Then, help us to be a people of truth - the truth lived out in Christ Jesus, to love and care for one another and to trust in You, so that YOU are passionately glorified. Amen.

Responsibilities include:

- Establish account records for members and others who designate monies for the general fund.
- Create receipt and deposit records weekly.
- Prepare articles for the Tower and weekly bulletins as needed.
- Tabulate and record in members' accounts pledges received.
- Receive, prepare, and deposit all monies for the general fund weekly.
- Provide Disbursement Treasurer with deposit information for the general fund weekly.
- Provide Office Manager with total receipts to budget and other special collections weekly.
- Maintain and post account records as needed.
- Prepare monthly report for publication in the Tower, of receipts to the General Fund.
- Prepare and distribute annual statement for all accounts by January 31st for the previous year.
- Order/purchase materials needed to accomplish Receiving Treasurer actions.
- Advise Session of any irregularities in giving trends as needed.
- Insure two church officers assist in counting/verifying currency and coin received in Sunday collections, and any time cash is received.





Massanetta Springs News . . .

Massanetta Springs "Fanning The Future Fundraiser"

Massanetta Springs' mission is to provide a place for all people to experience God through renewal, discovery, and hospitality. Last year, through the generosity of so many, we were able to fully fund the new Massanetta playground. This year's Great Community Give Day is April 17th, and we've dreamed big in launching our "Fanning The Future Fundraiser" that day. We are raising money for three things:

- Two industrial sized fans for the front of Hudson Auditorium. If you've ever sat in Hudson on a hot summer day, you know what comfort they will bring. But they'll do more than just circulate air. When people are more comfortable, they're less distracted, and more able to focus on things like worship and keynote. By installing the fans, we're helping our ministry become more effective.
- New Sound Equipment. Our current system has served us well for many years, but parts need to be retired, and our sound needs have grown. This is crucial to our summer ministry. Afterall, how can you take part in transformative ministry if you can't hear what's going on?
- Support for the 2019 Middle School, Bible, and Church Music Conferences. One of our constant challenges is providing life-changing ministry while keeping our fees modest. All funds raised over and above what we need for the fans and the sound equipment will support the conferences that form the core of our ministry offerings.

The total fundraising goal for this year is \$28,500, and there are already some people who have jumped in to help us get there. The fans will cost \$16,000, and a generous couple has come forward to challenge us to meet that goal by agreeing to match the first \$8,000 donated on that day. In addition, the Friends of Massanetta have agreed to sponsor \$1,000 in matching funds towards the sound equipment which we estimate will cost \$2,500. The combined cost of our first two goals is \$18,500. However, with matching funds, we only need to raise \$9,500 for them to be fully funded!

We also have a great opportunity to raise additional funds through the Great Community Give Leaderboards. Last year, 272 individual donors placed us second on the GCG Leaderboard which meant the Community Foundation provided us with an additional \$6,000. Our goal this year is to have at least 400 individual donors. Every gift of \$10 or more counts toward that total, so you can see every gift of every size will be very important on April 17th.

- Your gift must be given on April 17th between 6:30 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- Your gift must come through the Great Community Give online giving platform. We will post that link on our website, Facebook, Instagram, and email early on the morning of April 17th.


