

From the Pastor's Desk . . .

"April Showers bring May Flowers"

I can remember my grandmother repeating this catchy phrase when a rainy day thwarted my plans to play outside. She wanted me to understand that dark and dreary days of April set forth the unhindered beauty of the springtime blossoms of May, rendering rain as much a blessing as the sunshine. As I grew older, I began to understand her wisdom: a period of darkness and discomfort could, if I allowed it, provide the basis for a season of acceptance, growth, and joy.



Over the years, I have experienced my own bleak moments, days, and

even seasons. It is with each one that I have discovered something significant about myself: in my darkest times I experience my greatest understanding of a loving, ceaselessly gracious God who does not waste one single opportunity to mold us into the created being we were intended to be.

However, I have found that the hardest part about the dreary times is to be patient and remain grateful.

In seminary, I learned the Greek word for patience could also be translated as, "long suffering." That doesn't sound like fun, does it? Yet, I have realized it is because I lean on my own feeble understanding of my circumstances and I fight back. I can become self-absorbed, resistant, and sometimes even pout, and ask God: "why me?" This stance is far easier than accepting the "long-suffering" and waiting to see what God is trying to teach me.

To be grateful in the midst of the dark seasons is to see beyond the clouds and name what is good, right, and just around me. When I consciously choose to claim the power of the Spirit I can see His grace, wooing me to hang on tight. His grace is like a glimmer of morning light that peeks through a small crack in closed window blinds, affirming the gift of another day. As I learn more of God, I have found these "small cracks" of light come to me in all sorts of ways. Sometimes it is a call from a friend inviting me to get a cup of coffee, a child's smile at the checkout counter, or a homeless person who waves, smiling, from a street corner. It is simple moments like these that whisper into my soul *"Kelly-Ann, everything is going to be ok." In such tender intervals of grace, God reveals God's self to the broken places of my life. My heart then is ordered right because it is focused on gratitude.*

Gratitude leads to patience and helps us grow into the character God intended us to be, so that our life has the potential to reflect the life of Jesus Christ in the world...

If we profess, as Christians, to be an Easter people "living" in this power and hope, then we remember God's own, Jesus of Nazareth, walked willingly, humbly through a period of horrific darkness and discomfort to the "glimmering light" of the cross, so that we "get to" choose gratitude and patience in all that comes our way.

The life and death of Jesus Christ makes all things right. His example, teachings, and wooing Spirit claim for us the power of a true "life-giving" resurrection in all things. The "storm" showers, are capable of being glorious opportunities to resurrect a beautiful flower in us. Each time we endure this process patiently, and with gratitude, we become more Christ-like – more like what we were created to be and more available to spread seeds of Christ's love and promise into our home, our churches, our communities, our world.

"And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you." I Peter 5:10




