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### From the Shenandoah Presbytery's Committee on Transition . . .



The end of a ministry is often difficult for pastors and congregations, no matter what the circumstances. How pastors and congregations say *Goodbye* is just as important as how they say *Hello* and *Welcome*. At this critical time of transition, roles and responsibilities change, and it is up to pastors, congregational leaders, and church members to model for one another healthy boundaries. To effectively and graciously maintain such boundaries requires a clear understanding of expectations, and positive support of one another. The

Committee on Pastoral Transition is sensitive to this, and has created a policy to assist both pastors and congregations make their way through this difficult time.

When a pastor departs, CPT believes each congregation needs time and space to grieve, reflect, and dream - to reflect on past ministry, envision future ministries, and develop a strong relationship with a new pastor. Likewise, pastors need time and space to put their ministry in context, and reflect on what is now past, even as they look forward to the future.

Unfortunately, we have witnessed the great harm done to new pastoral relationships when this time and space is not granted. Former pastors who continue to engage members about the church, attend church functions, or make themselves visible on church premises inhibit the ability of the new pastor to build pastoral bonds with members of the congregation. Congregations that continue to reach out to the former pastor for care, council and participation in significant life events deprive the new pastor of crucial opportunities to build and deepen relationships with the congregation.

Of course, we know the Presbyterian Church is a small world, as is the Shenandoah Valley, so it is unrealistic to think it's possible to avoid any contact between former pastors and parishioners; much less is it very Christian. Let me be clear: it is NOT the policy of Shenandoah Presbytery to forbid such contact - but there *are* important considerations that cannot be ignored, in light of the changed circumstance.

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Our policy can be boiled down to this one sentence: While affection and esteem between the departing pastor and their former parishioners can, and should continue, the PASTORAL RE-LATIONSHIP MUST NOT. This is an important distinction, marking an essential boundary for the wellbeing of congregations and pastors alike. Friendships might continue to flourish after a pastor leaves, but these relationships must not include any pastoral discussion or services that are the province of the new pastor, e.g. hospital visits, weddings, funerals, baptisms, counseling, or upon any policies or programs of the church under the new pastor's leadership. In this, the wisdom and guidance of the <u>Book of Order</u> must be honored:

After the dissolution of the pastoral relationship, former pastors and associate pastors shall not provide their pastoral services to members of their former congregations without the invitation of the moderator of session. (G-2.0905)

It is expected that congregations will pray for the well-being of the departing pastor, and will bless their transition into retirement, a new call or a new phase of their life. Likewise, it is expected that departing pastors will continue to pray for the well-being of the congregation as individuals and as the gathered community.

It is expected that the departing pastor will bear the primary responsibility for maintaining healthy boundaries by refraining from and discouraging any requests for pastoral services, or interactions regarding issues of pastoral care, congregational life, or future pastoral leadership. Likewise, it is expected that congregation members will no longer make requests of the departing pastor regarding pastoral services, and will not approach the departing pastor regarding issues of pastoral care, congregational life, or future pastoral leadership.

I hope this helps clarify things a bit as you look forward to this important time of transition in the life of the Bethel congregation. My prayers are with you.


#### **BETHEL CONGREGATION**:

MEXICO MISSION TRIP 2019

Baja Mission Trip Summary & Update - 2019

First off let me thank the congregation of Bethel for supporting our mission trip to Baja. As we traveled to do God's work your prayers for

safe travel were well answered. After a long flight we arrived in San Diego where we had the opportunity to rest for a day and do some shopping for things we wanted to purchase for the families we would be helping this year. After leaving what would be called normal civilization, we traveled by van towards the mission base with a brief stop by Papa Rueben's a local food vendor that has good but more importantly safe food. Excited to meet the families we would be helping the next day, we then settled in to our sleeping quarters where eight of us slept in bunk beds in a small ten by twelve hut.

The Shenandoah Presbytery had enough people participate in the mission trip this year to form three build teams. We were also joined by a group from Washington state and a group from Oregon state at the mission base. During the week we all came together as brothers and sisters in Christ to accomplish great things for the people we were called to serve. These included an eye clinic to give those who came a chance to see again, passing out food bags with normal staples, visiting local churches, visiting the local orphanage, visiting families we had helped in the past, visiting the abused women's shelter, and most of all creating new relationships to spread God's word and show how Christians act and love all. By the end of the week we had new friends from the states and new families for future visits that the good Lord had sent us to serve. All five of these families now have brand new homes that were completely furnished and stocked with about three weeks worth of food. It is said that his works are to be done through us. I am humbled to be able to serve as I was called. - Bob Olson

#### Summerlee West Virginia Mission Project

Bethel Presbyterian Church was one of eight Presbyterian Churches to participate in the annual Summerlee Mission Project in Fayette County, West Virginia. Partnering along with Bethel Presbyterian and Westminster Presbyterian were Bethesda Presbyterian (Rockbridge Baths), Front Royal Presbyterian, Mt Horeb Presbyterian (Grottoes), Second Presbyterian (Waynesboro), Smyrna Presbyterian (Waynesboro), Tinkling Spring Presbyterian (Fishersville) and Jerusalem Chapel Seventh Day Adventist (Churchville). This year approximately 110 participants in total were present for the project. Completed health forms were required of all participants and the safety and health of all participants and homeowners was a core value.

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During the week of July 7th through July 13th Briana Lawhorne with her family and Mitch Lathrop represented Bethel for the repair of one of five homes in Fayette County which were previously chosen through the Department of Homeowner Services. As in past years five working days were allocated for repairs to the homes and care was taken to not begin any repairs which could not be finished within the allotted time period.

Repairs of the individual homes included roof leaks, repairs of holes in the flooring, correction of yard drainage problems, weed-eating and landscaping improvements, painting, repairing of window issues, replacement of tubs and plumbing, refurbishment of woodstoves, assessment of heat pumps, damaged siding replacement and replacement of doors and/or windows.

Typical work hours were between 7:30 am to 5:00 pm. The church consolidation provided breakfast and supper each work day at the campsite and sandwich food, fruit and Gatorade were provided for packing/carrying to the jobsites. At the end of each workday following supper a progress report was delivered by individual site foremen along with reporting of problems or setbacks. Devotions were delivered at both breakfast and supper.

The cooperation among participants and overall attitude were exceptional throughout the work week and next year's 2020 Summerlee Mission Project is highly anticipated by all.
