As This Elder Sees It . . .

Dear Bethel Family,

I hope this message finds you well. Every month our Bethel Tower provides the opportunity for an Elder to speak to the congregation. To my knowledge there are no specific guidelines to which we are bound, so I want to share with you my thoughts on "How I See It" here at Bethel.

For as long as I have worshiped God I have always recognized that my salvation has come down to this: I am a sinner and I alone am incapable of being good enough to make



it to heaven and to experience eternal life solely on my own accord. However, I recognize, believe, and accept with open arms that Christ Jesus died for me on the cross and it is by His grace through faith alone I am a child of God forever.

As believers in Jesus Christ we are eager to do God's work in this world in an endeavor to strengthen and grow His ministry. The overwhelming challenge is simply that the world we serve in is imperfect and so are we. Thus, it is inevitable that we will find ourselves in disagreement. This will occur in many different aspects in our spiritual walk with friends, family, work and yes, our church. As Christians we collectively agree and believe that we should seek out God's will not our own. So, my first question for you today is: Do we?

My second question to you today is: Does our community, do our friends, our neighbors, our world and our Lord know us by our love or by our divisions? I am not blind, nor are you. I see the concern in your faces on Sunday mornings and I can hear it in your conversations. In addition, I share conversations with many of you throughout the week and the same can be heard and discussed. Our division has consumed our church. So, my third and fourth questions for you today are: What purpose are we serving here? Are we serving the Lord or ourselves?

Dear friends let us not get so caught up in these issues within our church life that we miss the bigger picture. So, unless you can be certain that the issues we face matter most before our Lord please let them go and lay them at His feet. They are not worth our future together in Christ Jesus.

Jesus said, in John 13:34-35,: A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

Let's fight for restoration of family and unity within our beloved church in the name of Jesus Christ. Let us stand together and help our Lord build a Kingdom that has no end. Let's tear down these walls between us so the world will know us by our love, not by our division. I know this is not the easiest road, but remember: if mountains were smooth you couldn't climb them!

Every Sunday together as a church family we recite the Lord's Prayer. Hear your own words as Jesus taught us: "His Kingdom come; His will be done on earth as it is in heaven." This is His kingdom come, and we are his disciples. Remember, the disciples were not without struggle and confusion, but they put the Lord first. Let us do the same!



<u>Bethel Presbyterian Church</u> <u>Nomination of Church Officers</u>

It is time to start the process of electing officers for the Class of 2023, so they can attend training in February and be ready for ordination/installation in March. <u>The Nominating Committee is requesting that EVERY active member of the congregation participate in this process</u>! Help identify potential officers with your suggestions to the Nominating Committee. Do not worry that they may have already been suggested.

When thinking and praying about those congregation members to nominate, ask yourselves if they faithfully try to live their lives demonstrating the fruit of the spirit from Galatians 5:22-23 "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control"? Ask God who also might best be able to aid and assist in leading Bethel during this time of transition.




