Romans 8:18

For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing to the glory that is going to be revealed to us.

Dear Friends,

We find ourselves in very different place right now in our lives, likely a place none of us would have ever envisioned. Unfortunately, I am afraid that anxiety has consumed us. These emotional feelings leave us much more pessimistic than we should be. We all recognize the seriousness of our world today and how our current situation has impacted us and will continue to do so for the foreseeable future. Unbelievable times, no school, no social gatherings, no proms, no graduations, no dining out, limited recreation, and above all no worship! What can one say or how can one feel? I understand and am empathetic to the pessimistic outlook given these circumstances. But in these times we must remain strong, confident and optimistic. Never forget God's promises. He never has let us down or broken any of those promises.

Pessimism will lead to panic and fear and fear will cloud our judgement. Optimism will lead to certainty; certainty will lead to clear and concise action that is grounded on optimism.

In the spirit of optimism let me share a bit of levity with you today.
