Worship Committee News & Notes . . .

From the Worship Committee & Bethel Choir Director

Today, as a form of worship through storytelling, I want to share with you all a story about my own life and God's faithfulness. Some of you may be aware of the circumstances surrounding my arrival at Bethel in 2018, but I believe many of you do not know the whole tale. I want to take you back to several years before my arrival in Staunton.

When I was a young child of around seven or eight, I remember sitting in a children's bible study at my home church in Raleigh, NC. We had been talking about "God's Plan for You," and I decided that day to grow up to be a church choir director. I loved music, I admired my church choir director, and it seemed the most logical way to use the gifts I had been given. Of course, as children we want to grow up to be not just anything but EVERYthing. So, my dream of choir directing quickly passed into a desire to be a chef, followed by a quick stint as a wannabe radiology technician (interesting choice for an eight-year-old, I know). Years and many new dreams later, I found myself inspired by my high school choir teacher to love vocal music once again. So, I set off on a path towards a degree in music education. However, at this point, the decision I made in that childhood Sunday school room was all but forgotten.

Years later, I make it through school and set out on my own as a new teacher. My first job is two-in-one; I was the new choir teacher for two middle schools! I was scared, but prepared. I struggled and learned as I went, and after the first semester at one school, I felt fairly confident in my abilities. However, as the second semester began and I was set to begin at my second placement, I began to have doubts that this was the path meant for me. I will spare the details of my soul-searching that went on that semester, but I will say that through a difficult time in my emotional journey, I realized that teaching public school was not my true passion. There was something missing. I had been inspired by my own public school choir teacher to love vocal music, and I thought the only way I could share that love with other people was by becoming a choir teacher myself. Finally realizing that I had pigeon-holed myself into a single career option, I chose to take a step back and evaluate where I had come from. It was during this time that my wife was accepted into Mary Baldwin's graduate program for Shakespeare, and Staunton was on our radar. August came and it was time to move to a new town. I was jobless and lost, without a career direction.

It was at this time that I began to look back more closely over my life to see what things had inspired and influenced my upbringing. The memory of child-me sitting in a Sunday school room popped into my head. I realized that I had spent my entire childhood and young adult life preparing for something. Church choir, handbells, youth praise band, mission trips, vacation bible school, worship leading... These were all cornerstones of the man I had become without even realizing it. I cut my teeth in the church, became a leader through volunteering my time there, and decided that this was the direction I needed to go next. But I had no connections in my new town and did not know where to start.

So, I prayed. I prayed for wisdom in my decision-making, I prayed for patience with God's timeline, I prayed for the strength to make tough decisions, and I prayed for God to help reveal the next right thing for me to do. (Sidebar, I have learned over the years that, for me, prayer works more efficiently when we pray for "changes of heart, not changes of situation." God works through his people, after all)

I sent emails to every church in Staunton that I could find with a Google search, and was met with a harmonized and resounding "No, thank you." I was devastated. But in one email, after the "No, thank you," there was something else. "I hear that Bethel Presbyterian may be in need of a new music director. You should reach out to them."

And the rest is as you know it. God's plan does not take the shape we expect it to. I am grateful that God pointed me in this direction, even though it took years of questioning, wondering, and soul-searching. I was prepared from birth to fulfill a childhood promise to God and myself that I would lead God's people in music. And my life has yet to finish, so there will no doubt be new directions and new paths to take to fulfill that goal. But, if you trust in the path laid out before you, God will surprise you. God is faithful, always.
