Message of the Week . . .

For I hold you by your right hand I, the Lord your God. And I say to you, don't be afraid. I am here to help you.

- Isaiah 41:13 New Living Translation (NLT)

I'm not sure about you, but I believe we all have fears. Some of us don't want to admit them and we may even be embarrassed by them. But fear surfaces, almost instantaneously, given our current situation in these unprecedented times. When it surfaces, the immediate remedy is prayer and trust. When we pray to God and we trust the reality of God's presence, power, protection, and provision for our lives, only then can we share in the joy God intends for us.

The people of God should not be a fearful people! The phrase "Fear not" or "Be not afraid" is found 365 times in the Bible. In 1933, our newly elected president Franklin D. Roosevelt addressed a tattered nation that was still reeling from the Great Depression. Hoping to ignite a more optimistic outlook regarding that economic crisis, he declared, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself!"

When we begin to believe that God is absent, or doubt whether or not He is with us, when we are anxious and frightened, we need to stop, as the Psalmist tells us in **Psalm 46:10** "**Be still and know that I am God**". We need to do the same. Be still, and know that God is God and He promises to be with us. With that in our spirit, heart and mind we can hold fast and be confident in the fact God is with us. If God is with us, if we really believe that, then we can stand on the foundation that we will not be overwhelmed by life.

There was a rich couple whose bedroom was on the second floor of their Manhattan townhouse. Almost every other day the wife, after getting into bed, would tell the husband to go and check downstairs, reassure the doors were locked because there were certainly thieves around. The husband eventually found out that the noises they were hearing were being made by the neighboring cats at their front gate leading into their townhouse. As a routine he would go whenever his wife would ask him to check, always searching for her perceived thieves. This went on for 30 years of marriage. One day as usual the wife sent him down to check for the thieves. When the husband went down, sure enough there was a thief who pointed a gun at him. The thief said, "Do not make a sound; just give me your valuables." He went and got the valuables and gave them to the thief. The thief turned around and was about to run off and the man said, "Hey there, wait a minute, you cannot leave yet, you've got to come upstairs and meet my wife." The thief said, "What, Why?" The husband said, "Well, frankly she has been expecting you for the last 30 years."

Friends, all through the day we have the choice to believe that either God is in control and good things are in store for us or we can go around worried, negative, and expecting the worst. I hear people say, "I am afraid"! "I am afraid about the future of my children. I am afraid for my nation. I am afraid of these times"! What they do not realize is that they are surrounded by fear instead of faith and very soon that fear will become reality.

We all face fear from time-to-time. So, we need to know how to face it. Currently, along with the rest of the world, we are living in unprecedented times . Again, our current situation has instilled fear in many. However, in spite of all this, God's people are not to live in fear. Do you have a reason to hold on to your fear when God said do not fear? How can you say that, you might ask. Well, it's simple, God knows all! Is there anything about you that God does not know? Can he handle it? Does he know you? Then give it to him.

In 2019 Bethel gave \$750, from our benevolence budget, to help support the Kingsway Help Center. There were also donations of clothing, household items and food as well as Bethel congregation members who volunteered.

Because of support from individuals, area clubs, churches and schools, Kingsway distributed 153,478 pounds of food in 2019, which is an average of 12,790 pounds per month. There was an average of 146 families served per month and a total of 424 individuals.
