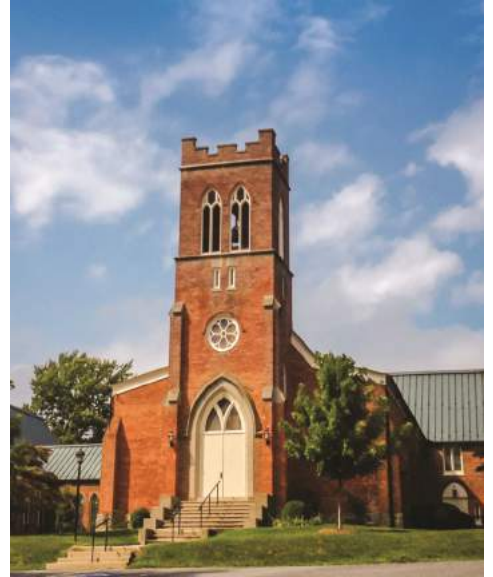

As This Elder Sees It . . .

*I lift my eyes up to the hills—
where does my help come from?
My help comes from the Lord,
the Maker of heaven and earth.
Psalm 121: 1-2*

Blue Ridge Mountains to the East and the Allegheny Mountains to the West, here in the Shenandoah Valley we only must raise our eyes to seek help from our Lord. These mountains not only serve to remind us of our Lord's presence but have offered us protection during this Coronavirus pandemic. Safer at home also means safer here in the valley, our numbers are not as high as Richmond, Hampton Roads nor Northern Virginia. None the less, the virus is here. Following our governor's guidelines here are suggestions as to how Bethel can help make church a safe place for everyone to come and worship. We are planning to start with outdoor worship services at the Chapel in the Woods June 21st followed by services in the Sanctuary July 12th.



Keep in mind these guidelines were written May 24th (Phase 1) and some suggestions may not apply to our needs in late June. Although, I do feel face masks, social distancing and hand sanitizers will be around for a long time. More specific guidelines for our outdoor services will be available the closer we get June 21st.

Phase 1

General Guidelines:

- ◆ You are safer staying at home.
- ◆ If you feel sick, please do not come to church.
- ◆ There are no social gatherings of more than 10 people.
- ◆ Social distancing will be continued.
- ◆ Please pick-up your own bulletin. We will not have designated greeters.
- ◆ Pews will be roped off with every third pew available. Of course, family members may sit together.

Specific Bethel Guidelines:

- ◆ The Fellowship Hall will be set-up with tables and chairs for meetings using the six feet distance rule.
- ◆ Offering plates will be placed on wooden stools at all entrances.
- ◆ The Worship Committee is rearranging the “Giving of Tithes & Offerings” during the worship service.
- ◆ The Bethel Choir and Handbell Choir will be on summer break.
- ◆ Hymns* will not be sung and only keyboard music will be used.

Guidelines regarding use of masks:

- ◆ Extra facemasks will be available in the vestibule, please use these masks while in the church building.

Additional information specific for places of worship:

- ◆ Limits on businesses and faith communities will be eased.
- ◆ Churches will be allowed to meet at 50% capacity.

Enhanced cleaning and disinfection at Bethel:

- ◆ Rooms that have not been used will be closed off. This includes rooms upstairs, downstairs, the Church Kitchen, Memorial Hall, the Choir Room and the Bumgardner Classroom.
- ◆ Jon & Donna Bush will focus on cleaning and disinfecting the rooms that are used so those are sanitized.
- ◆ Hand sanitizers will be placed at all outside door entrances and in rooms where meetings take place.

This phase could last for two to four weeks or even longer.

Phase 2

General Guidelines:

- ◆ The vulnerable population should continue to stay at home.
- ◆ If you feel sick or are concerned about being in public, please stay home.
- ◆ There will not be any social gatherings of more than 50 individuals.

Specific Bethel Guidelines:

- ◆ Bethel will be open with plans for using the Fellowship Hall to handle extra people over the 50 allowed in the Sanctuary.

Additional Guidelines

- ◆ Social distancing will continue - using the same guidelines as in phase 1.
- ◆ Face coverings in public will still be recommended.

This phase could last for two to four weeks or even longer.

Phase 3

To move to Phase 3, everyone will be checking for no evidence of a rebound for a sustained period of time.

General Guidelines:

- ◆ The vulnerable population will be safer at home.
- ◆ The ban on social gatherings will be removed.
- ◆ Capacity limits in establishments will be lifted.
- ◆ Heightened cleaning and disinfection will be continued.
- ◆ Additional measures are possible.

This phase could last ten to twelve weeks or even longer.

Please note that a lower percentage of positive test results will be needed to move on to the next phase.

Please note that there has been a change since the “As This Elder Sees It” article was written. Effective Friday, May 29th, Gov. Northam has announced that all people will need to wear face coverings inside public places or businesses. This order is taking effect through Executive Order 63.

Kingsway Report - 2019

TO; FRIENDS AND SUPPORTERS OF KINGSWAY HELP CENTER;

Greetings to all of you, our loyal dedicated donars in so many ways which keep the wheels rolling here at Kingsway Help Center. At this writing and for the record, our Staff here at the Center are meeting the challenge of the time..namely the Coronavirus that has swept through our world. In order to continue serving in a safe and yet servicable way, the building proper is open only to staff and volunteers. Our Food Distribution day is "Drive-through" only for the health and safety of our clients. But, I digress...


This report covers 2019 and, thanks to the generous continuance of the Churches, the Organizations and the personal giving, 2019 was a bountiful year.. We were able to distribute 153,478 Pounds of food - THAT averages 12,790 pounds per month - THAT averages over 6 tons per month !! What a blessing for the average of 146 families that we served - and that averages to some 424 individuals that we were able to give a "hand-up" to. Our numbers of families was a bit down in 2019 and we consider that a good thing. February, 2019 was our lightest month (120 families) and November. 2019 was our record month serving 181 families.

We feel very blessed that we are in a position to pass along the other various needs to those that pass through our doors, namely the number of items of clothing, kitchen wares, bedding, furniture and appliances. A note regarding the larger items, we gladly accept these, however, we are in no position to pick up OR deliver.

There are many churches, organizations, school departments and individuals who hold "drives" for designated items at special times of the year. Particular needs are met and soo much appreciated. We also salute and acknowledge the various Pastors who volunteer their time on the 3rd Wednesday of each month to bring devotions and encouragement to our Staff and volunteers on this our usually busiest day. Although, there are 25-30 volunteers that put in some approximately 30 hours a week sorting, sizing and storing all the clothing, foodstuffs, etc. Not all are there at the same time, but come gladly and happy to serve. Volunteers are always welcome - no experience necessary !!

We take this opportunity to especially thank the Spottswood-Raphine Ruritan Club for the use (rent free!) of the building in which we work. With all the continued prayers, and grateful support, we do the Lord's work with our hands. We appreciate all who make our mission of serving through Kingsway Help Center a success.

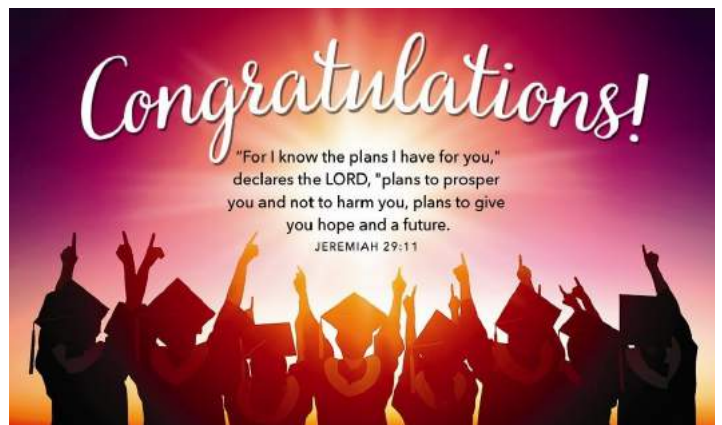

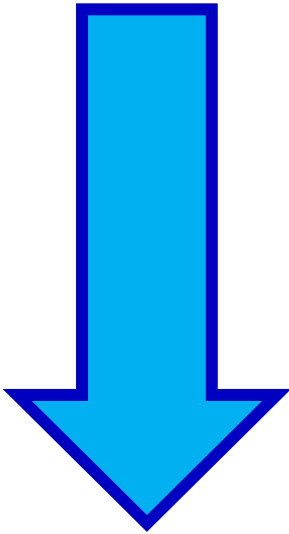
