As This Elder Sees It & The Weekly Message ...

Guiding Principles From the First Church


Romans 12:10-11 "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord;"

I can say for certain that one human trait that is not hereditary is scholarliness. It is however, great, to have an ancestor that was one because he left a generous amount of reading material. Recently reading a book by Dr. Turner titled Addresses and Sermons one sermon stood out, titled The message of the First Century Church to the Church of the Twentieth Century. It feels even more appropriate today in the twenty-

first century. So now the challenge is to condense an eleven page sermon into several paragraphs for you.

The first century church suffered many persecutions, trials, tribulations, and Christians falling away. The church appeared to be in trouble. Then in the year 187 AD, Justin Martyr, writing to the Emperor of Rome says, "You cannot put us down now. We are everywhere. In your court, in your camp, everywhere." The church had emerged triumphant.

Dr. Turner laments some of the problems of the twentieth century church as shrinking budgets, groups for whom the church has no meaning and have grown cynical, and those still in the church who have lost the meaning of being Christian in their daily lives. His summation is "The world is crying out for moral and spiritual leadership and we are groping and confused. We have the promise of power but are keenly conscious of our lack of power to deal adequately with the problems that these conditions raise.

Examining the early Church he finds four traits that were the secret to their power:

- (1) The Church began with the deepening and enrichment of the spiritual lives of her members. Luke 24:49 "Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."
- (2) It was a Spirit filled Church.
 Acts 1:8 "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."
- (3) The Church preached an exalted Christ.
 Acts 5:31 "He is the one whom God exalted to His right hand as a Prince and a Savior, to grant repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins."
- (4) They built a fellowship.
 Ephesians 2:19 "Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God"

Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."

It is believable that today's Church is in an even more precarious position than when this sermon was preached, but the good news is that our God is the same God that brought victory to the early Church and the faithful that build on these principles will also be victorious.

Summerlee Mission Project, 2020

The current year, 2020, has been described up to this point as the "New Normal", Challenging Times, Uncertain Times and yet the presence of the COVID-19 pandemic was not powerful enough to cancel the annual Summerlee Mission Project. The mission project was moved to Augusta County to improve local homes rather than traveling to Summerlee (Beckley), West Virginia. Adjustments were planned for and made so that safety was a top priority, not only from the perspective of accidents and avoidance of property damage, but also to focus on the long-term health of project participants. There was practically no interior work scheduled and in general all projects were on the exterior of homes in Waynesboro, Barren Ridge (New Hope), Staunton, Greenville, Parnassus, Augusta Springs and Craigsville.

The participation level was expectedly smaller, 64 individuals in comparison to 110 of last year and precautionary steps were enforced for mission workers just as for anyone else entering a grocery store or conversing on the sidewalk. Check-in meetings were held each morning at Westminster Presbyterian to have participant's temperatures taken and to record answers to health-pertinent questions, for example; have you felt poorly over the last 24 hours, have you been around anyone who has Covid-19 during the past week, do you have shortness of breath or severe headaches?

Current projects for the week included 1) replacing a front porch in Waynesboro (Dupont area), 2) construction of a handicap ramp on the back of a home in the New Hope area, 3) painting of several homes in various places including two locations in Waynesboro, 4) roof repairs on a trailer in Craigsville as well as 5) a home in Parnassus, 6) replacement of decking and steps on a home off of Hopeman Parkway in Waynesboro, 7) door framing/repairs and electrical work for a home in Greenville, 8) furniture repair and refurbishment.

At the end of each workday a progress report was delivered by individual site foremen along with reporting of problems or setbacks. Following progress reporting devotions were delivered through the technology of Zoom.

Gratitude and accolades are sent to all who participated and especially those who coordinated the mission project during less than optimal conditions, Pastor April Cranford, Steve Yancey and his family, Curtis Foltz and numerous other coordinators. It was a gratifying positive experience to help and assist local community members. We look forward to next year's Summerlee Mission.
