MESSAGE OF THE WEEK

Who asked who?

Did Jesus ask Peter to walk to him on the water and/or did Peter ask Jesus to tell him to walk on the water? Let's get caught up.

A lot has been going on in Matthew 14 – John the Baptist was beheaded; Jesus fed the 5,000. The Lectionary for Sunday 8/9 gives us: Matthew 14:22-27

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. ²³ After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone, ²⁴ and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it. ²⁵ Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. ²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear. ²⁷ But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." (NIV)

How many times have we read "don't be afraid" or "fear not" or some other phrase, maybe from an angel, trying to reassure someone in the Bible? How can we know for sure things will be OK? Whom can we trust? The disciples were not sure, Peter questioned Jesus, ²⁸ "Lord, if it is you, tell me to come to you on the water."

²⁹ "Come," he said.

So, I invite you to Worship with us at 10 AM at the Chapel in the Woods this Sunday (August 9th) where we will continue thinking about this passage and I would also like for you to "Walk a Mile in my Reeboks."
