



The Session met August 9th, 2020 with Rev. Patrick Pettit as Moderator and nine members present. The Session used Zoom to meet virtually.


- The minutes of the last Session meetings were approved.
- The Session approved an updated copy of the Wedding Policy for all weddings held at Bethel. This project has been in the approval process for a few years as revisions and changes were made.
- The Deacons have purchased four touchless hand sanitizer dispensers to place at the entrances of the church, to be available for use when worship is held inside.
- The Session passed a motion to strongly recommend the wearing of face coverings during the worship services when entering and exiting the Sanctuary. This policy is for all indoor worship services.
- The Session agreed to a future plan to possibly erect a 40-foot flagpole, on the knoll below the Scout Hut, to memorialize all veterans. Veterans will also be invited for small dedication services when the project is complete.






If possible please print out and/or bring a copy of the Order of Worship with you each Sunday. It will be needed for the responsive Call to Worship and any other unison readings.

Dear Church Community,

YOU can make a difference in your community by joining hands with the Health Equipment Loan Program, Inc. (H.E.L.P.) located in Churchville. With your support we can continue to provide no-cost loans of gently-used home medical equipment free of charge to residents of Staunton, Waynesboro and Augusta County. For many, these products are not covered by health insurance or are under-covered leaving them with costs that they cannot afford, especially now with the added challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since our launch in September 2014, the all-volunteer staff have opened the H.E.L.P. doors and their hearts in over 3500 instances to assist nearly 1100 area families. We have grown from a small collection of gently-used medical equipment (like walkers, bedside commodes and wheelchairs) to over 3500 pieces of equipment including hospital beds, lifts, shower items and numerous disposable items. Most of these were collected from our community and purchased through grant awards and donations.

The kindness and concern shared by H.E.L.P. volunteers, as they work to match individual needs to equipment and supplies, serve to lighten worries and lift spirits as illustrated by a recent thank-you note:

*Thank you for the wonderful work you do. I was distraught when I arrived at your door exactly one week ago. My husband had a fall and hit his head and was not able to walk without support. He had been sitting in a chair at home for 3 days and I did not know what to do. Someone told me to google H.E.L.P so I came to you last week. What a relief! You were all so kind! Thank you!"

We have been blessed in our God-led mission as our overcrowded facility testifies. But H.E.L.P. needs a home! The business owner, who has generously provided H.E.L.P. a home over the past 5 years, plans to retire in September 2020!! The business, Churchville Pump Service, will continue under new ownership in a new location.

After looking at a variety of locations, we have decided our best option is to stay where we are. So we have started a Capital Campaign aimed at raising \$200,000 to purchase and remodel our current location to better serve YOU! We have raised nearly \$50,000 to date.

H.E.L.P. needs YOUR help! We are asking area churches to support us in this local outreach by either sending a check made payable to H.E.L.P., Inc. or donating electronically via the secure Donate button at our website https://medicalcloset.org.

Riverheads Weekday Religious Education

This month Bethel is taking a moment to highlight and update you on the work of the Weekday Religious Education (WRE) program, which Bethel is a supporter of, at Riverheads Elementary School. WRE classes started Tuesday, August 18th, which was also the first day of school for Augusta County. Guidelines regarding COVID-19 will be encouraged: wearing a mask, social distancing, hand sanitizer as the students come in and out of the building, and cleaning and sanitizing the classroom for each new group of students.

Each child has a basket of their own materials to use in the WRE class-room so the sharing of supplies will not be necessary.

Dana Cash is excited that WRE classes have resumed! She is also beginning her 33rd year of teaching WRE. Cathy Bartley has agreed to assist Dana which will make possible all the new changes and scheduling challenges forced by the COVID-19 pandemic.
