

'Martha, Martha,' the Lord answered, 'you are worried about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.'" - Luke 10:40-42

Over the course of our lives, we all find ourselves in an overwhelmed state.

Every morning we wake up with a defined agenda, our lives have schedules and responsibilities, everywhere we turn, there are things that need

I already know the answer, and so does our most recent Nominating Committee. Simply put, it is hard to be generous when you are completely spent!

Over the past week or so, I am sure we all have sat down in exhaustion and thought of our "to do lists" and realized we have failed somewhere in our plan.

- Everyone else can keep a kitchen clean.
- Everyone else has dinner on the table.
- Everyone else has a "budget" and can stay within it.
- Everyone else can manage multiple things at a time.
- Everyone else can be two places simultaneously.
- Everyone else can do everything else that I cannot.

This is mental defeat.

Yesterday was Ashlyn's birthday, Cindy, and I both worked a full schedule, as Ashlyn went to school and finished her day up with cheerleading practice. I had an early day planned so that I could go home, take care of all the farm chores, straighten up the house, pick up the food for dinner and be set to go for a 7:00 pm party time. Let us just say, I was late, finished my to do list at breakneck speed and was still not even close to being on time or ready as everyone was waiting on me to come back with dinner.

Guess what? No one was paying attention to any of the things I held a magnifying glass to. When I arrived home with dinner, late, the spirit of the house was light and humorous. Everyone was enjoying their visit with each other and enjoying being there with Ashlyn on her special day.

The point I am trying to make is I almost missed the important part because I was consumed with the wrong things.

I immediately realized there was no crisis of schedule or physical priorities. It was a gathering of friends and family content in being with each other simply filled with food, furniture, and love. In my state of mind to make things perfect for a lack of a better term I almost missed the gift of Christ. The love and friendship contained in that moment of time, unrepeatable that will never come again because life moves at a lightning speed.

With this said, I guarantee that less than 5% of what we all call "crises" are crises. It is the classic Mary-Martha situation found in our previously mentioned scripture reading:

"But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, 'Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!' 'Martha, Martha,' the Lord answered, 'you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.'"

Friends, the long and short of this article is to simply say we can be so consumed with our own lives that we rarely spend our available time in worry and in prayer for the people who are in crisis.

#### Examples of human crisis:

- The preteen girl on the side of the road, waiting for a stranger to use her body so there will be food for dinner because she is homeless and indigent.
- The baby, curled up and unmoving on a hospital bed, as her unemployed mother helplessly is rocking back and forth and explaining to the doctor that she has had a fever for four solid days and she waited to have her seen because she has no insurance to pay for her care.
- The homeless man living in a cardboard box under a bridge, because he simply cannot read or write and is unable to care for himself.
- A father and mother of three both losing their jobs because of a scheduled employment reduction.
- A family of four in intensive care after being struck head on by another vehicle.
- A newborn baby in a NICU with no family to love them.
- An individual who does not know the Lord and the salvation his love relationship brings.

Have we been so busy and so preoccupied that we have missed it? Yes, we have, more times than we care to count.

Today let us make a change, every time we catch ourselves in a panic, let us remember it is likely not something worth panicking about. We need to remember that there is real human crisis in the world. We can close our eyes and remind ourselves that we can either waste our time complaining that no one is helping us prepare for the events in life, or we can lay these grievances at the feet of Jesus and pray for the kind of heart that breaks for the right things.

I am so grateful for the files of artwork, the photos of new clothes and backpacks and the scribbled words that get better with every letter. What a gift.

Let us refuse to be so busy that we can't remember those less fortunate than us. When we do, there is a shift in our spirit. A realignment that brings a grateful spirit as we are in a relationship with our Lord and Savior.

Lord, let us be the kind of people who love the way You do and push through the chaos to reach what matters. In Jesus name, amen.



#### GUEST MINISTER - MARCH 28TH, 2021 - PALM SUNDAY

Bethel welcomes the Rev. Malcolm Brownlee as the Guest Minister on March 28th.

Rev. Brownlee grew up in Rockbridge Baths, Virginia, and moved back there 10 years ago to retire. He has been pastor of churches in Hazard, Kentucky; Riverdale, Georgia; and Huntersville, North Carolina, and interim pastor of churches in Lexington, North Carolina; Beckley, West Virginia; and Fairfield and Rockbridge Baths, Virginia. From 1973 till 1984 he and his wife Sarah were missionaries in Indonesia. Bethel was one of their supporting churches during that time.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMMUNION ON MARCH 28TH, 2021

Communion during the COVID-19 pandemic will be normal except for how you receive the elements. Bethel will be making our own disposable (fresh) elements using plastic cups. Please pick up one of each, juice and bread, as you enter the sanctuary and follow Rev. Brownlee's instructions as we normally do. <u>Elders will not be handing out the elements</u>.

Rev. Brownlee will conduct the usual Prayer of Thanksgiving and when it is time to partake of the elements, he will say, "The bread of Life take and eat". We will then take the bread together. (Note that there will be gluten free kits available but there are only a few kits total. Please only take one if you have gluten sensitivities or an allergy.) After a moment or two, Rev. Brownlee will say "the cup of salvation", and we will then drink the juice together.

Trash bins will be available at the door for the used cups. Elders will be present on each side and in back to help if needed, while keeping social distancing guidelines.



## UPDATE ON THE PROCESS OF SEPARATION FROM THE PCUSA

Prior to the stated February Session meeting (Sunday, February 14th, 2021) the Session met with the Shenandoah Presbytery Listening Committee. This Presbytery committee is charged with visiting churches who are considering the option of leaving the PCUSA. They gather information along with listening to the concerns and reasoning of the Session in regard to beginning the dismissal process from the PCUSA.

The Bethel Session spent an hour explaining the feelings of the Elders (and Deacons) of Bethel along with their reasoning as to why they believe leaving the PCUSA is the best option for <u>our</u> church.

In the coming months the Presbytery Listening Committee will also be gathering opinions from you (the active congregation) to understand your feelings and your reasons why you may want to stay or may want to leave the PCUSA. As you answer their questions you are welcome to ask them any questions you may have.



All congregation members should have received a letter a few weeks ago detailing the reasons why the Session has chosen to separate from the PCUSA denomination. This letter is extremely important for you to read so please contact the Church Office if you did not receive a copy. Thank you!

#### Continuing Education Scholarships & Loan Funds

#### KAREN KOOGLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Karen Koogler's family has established a scholarship in memory of Karen. The family has collectively provided a monetary gift to be utilized as seed money to assist Riverheads (only) graduates who wish to become a full-time educator upon graduation from college.



The scholarship is open ended and can receive additional benevolence into the principle over and above the seed money contributed by Karen's family. Additional contributions can be made at any time by anyone wishing to do so.

Recipients are Riverheads High School students who are seeking a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Education. The student(s) will be chosen by the High School's Guidance Department based on their qualifications. At the completion of their application process the school's guidance department will notify the Scholarship Committee and request the available funds to be paid to the appropriate institution of higher learning where the scholarship recipient will be attending.

The Scholarship Fund will be managed by the Endowment Committee and the Stewardship & Finance Committee will serve as oversight. All contributions can be sent to Bethel Presbyterian Church via check. The check can be made out to the church and in the memo portion please indicate Karen Koogler Memorial Scholarship Fund.

#### Continuing Education Scholarships & Loan Funds

#### BETHEL PRESBYTERIAN CHRISTIAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Bethel Christian Scholarship Fund/Program has been established for members of Bethel and their children who wish to further their education in institutions of higher learning or vocational education and training. The person seeking a scholarship will apply to the church's Scholarship Committee for approval and award authorization.

Once awarded the Scholarship Committee will pay the awarded amount directly to the appropriate institution of higher learning or vocational school where the scholarship recipient will be attending.

Recipients of this scholarship <u>must be a member of Bethel Presbyterian Church</u>. The scholarship cannot be awarded outside the membership of Bethel. The applicant must be enrolled as an active member, child of an enrolled active member, or a grandchild of an enrolled active member (whereby legal custody has been granted to the grandparent).

The scholarship is open ended and can receive additional benevolence into the principle over and above the seed money redistributed to establish it. Additional contributions can be made at any time by anyone wishing to do so.

The Scholarship Fund will be managed by the Endowment Committee, and the Stewardship & Finance Committee will serve as oversight. All contributions can be sent to Bethel Presbyterian Church via check. The check can be made out to the church and in the memo, portion please indicate Bethel Christian Scholarship Fund.



#### BETHEL PRESBYTERIAN CONTINUING EDUCATION LOAN FUND

The Bethel Presbyterian Church Continuing Education Loan Fund was established a number of years ago due to the generosity of an anonymous donor to assist young people in furthering their education. Financial aid from this fund is disbursed in the form of an *interest-free* loan (that must be paid back once the recipient has left school and/or has finished their education).

Aid from this fund is available to church members for any post-high school education - college or vocational education and training. Applications are available in the Church Office. 
