As This Elder Sees It & The Weekly Message

STRUGGLES

In these trying times we are in – and life in general, we all have struggles of many sizes. The reason for our struggles has many factors and causes. Self-inflicted or from the action of others. Whatever is creating the turmoil in our lives will be exponentially great going at it alone.

When we turn to the Bible, we see strife, turmoil and struggles from Genesis all the way through Revelations. Why? Well, if we look at just one author, for example the writings of Paul, to explain some of the reasons why.

1. God allows us to struggle to keep us humble and to return to Him.

Corinthians 12:7-10

⁷So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited. ⁸Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. ⁹But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong. (continued)

Accept your shortfalls.

2. Struggle exists because of the sin living within us. As humans we tend to take credit for God's work and then blame Him when things go wrong.

Romans 7:14-20

¹⁴ For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin. ¹⁵ For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶ Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with the law, that it is good. ¹⁷ So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

When we make the choice to be a Christian, we admit the sin within us, but the sinful nature does not leave us, it is always there.

3. Struggles are for us to gain and grow in Christ.

Philippians 3:7-11

⁷But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith— ¹⁰that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

We have struggles because we allow the sin within us to control our thoughts and actions. In conclusion, our struggles, the struggles we have, are from the sinful nature of ourselves and from the sinful nature of others. Therefore, to understand our struggles, we must find and admit the sin within and bring them to God, lay them at His feet and learn from them to be humbly closer to Him.


