

#### As This Elder Sees It & The Weekly Message



#### **FREEDOM**

July is a month for celebrating the freedom of our nation. We proudly display our flags, plan picnics, enjoy a day off from work, listen to patriotic music and watch fireworks. As we celebrate freedom this month let us reflect, on how we truly became free and how the word of God is a guide to maintain freedom in our life.

Galatians 5:13

You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. (NIV)

As with many scriptures in the Bible, one verse can be very powerful and guide us for a lifetime. In this scripture, the Apostle Paul is speaking to his fellow Christians, and explaining that we are chosen by God. God will not allow us to be taken away from him. Being a servant of Christ, is a service of freedom. We must use the freedom granted to us by God to make wise choices and be held accountable for these choices. By granting us freedom and forgiveness of our sins, this allows us to serve others in love and humility, as he has taught us. Service, love and freedom are repeated throughout the Bible.

Freedom provides us an opportunity to serve. We often take this for granted, both spiritually, socially, and politically. We are not individually forced to serve, to live in a free country. We are not obligated to serve in the military to live in the United States, but we depend on those who do to remain safe and free. We are not forced to be a public servant to live in this country, but we depend on the service jobs and government to maintain safety, law and order. Spiritually, we are on our own to be a servant of God, but as with the other areas of services mentioned, we often fall short.

Most of us have never lived in another country that is not blessed to have the inalienable rights provided by the constitution. We have lived no other life. We can read about it, talk about it, pray about it, but we have not truly experienced it.

How can we serve one another humbly in love?

Spiritually, we must strive to be closer to God, through study of the Bible, prayer, service to others and service in our church. Most all of us do this to some degree but there is always more we can do.

For Christians, being a servant in society requires us to live as God would want us to live. This is well defined in the Bible. For example, the ten commandments, teach us basic rules for living. The Bible is our moral compass for life and can be applied to any social situation and remains always relevant in every situation. As hard as we try, we will sin. God recognizes we are imperfect, yet he does not enslave us in these sins. Through our acceptance in Christ Jesus, we are forgiven and granted eternal freedom from sin, if we follow His word.

Politics is a touchy situation. It is well known many of our founding fathers were Christians and their belief in God was very influential in both their daily lives and their governance of our new nation. We can see this example clearly in the penmanship of Thomas Jefferson when he authored the Declaration of Independence. George Washington is quoted as saying "It is impossible to rightly govern a nation without God and the Bible". We must use our freedom to vote. Vote for those leaders who most closely reflect our Christian beliefs and who are Christians themselves. We must pray for our leaders, not just in the United States but the world. We must pray for the oppressed countries who are not allowed to live or worship freely. Pray for the military, who protect these rights and risk their lives. Pray for our country that we can come together as a nation under God and grow stronger.

Ronald Reagan professed that "If we ever forget that we are one nation under God...then we are a nation gone under." This seems to ring true as our nation continues to face turmoil and strife in and amongst itself. We have become a nation that focuses less on God, and more on ourselves. We can overcome this with prayer, strong conviction in our beliefs, and service to God. Please remember *freedom* was granted to us by God. Our founding fathers built a nation on God's freedom. We should never forget or take this for granted, but live-in love and service, as he has taught us. Celebrate freedom every day and in doing so give the thanks to God.

In the meantime, the Listening Committee would like to offer informational meetings for all <u>active members of the congregation at Bethel the evenings of Tuesday, July 6th, 2021 and Tuesday, July 13th, 2021. The time will most likely be 6:30 p.m. Please know that the Listening Committee will be in charge of the meeting. And this will not be a time to debate issues.</u>

Rather, the purpose of these informational meetings in July is 1) to offer those who may have not been contacted with the opportunity to give their views to the listening team, and 2) to provide information about PCUSA policies that they sense are not completely understood based on some of the comments they received.
