PSALM 98:8 Let the rivers clap their hands, Let the mountains sing together for joy.

Growing up here at Bethel, I accepted things at face value and questioned things to myself, those of you that know me probably find that hard to believe. But these days, young folks don't keep their questions to themselves. Now that I am serving on Session, I know that the things I questioned as a teen are the same things young people question now. There are questions I've been afraid to ask now, because some people are so strong in their convictions that I fear rocking the boat. Many of the folks I worried about asking questions have gone on before us. And here our boat sits, 35 or so years later. And our boat is floating.

So we should be happy. Or should we?

Growing up, I wondered why rarely there was applause. I attended services with my friends at their home churches and many of them were such lively worship celebrations, except for my visits to Temple. I must admit, I didn't understand anything going on, except for the fact that wine poured freely.

Being confirmed in church was very ceremonious. Or I felt like it was. I felt very intimidated and judged, which is the last thing we should feel at church. And when you talk to young people, of any generation, they will always bring up music.

Fast forward to a pandemic and all pomp and circumstance went out the window for our youth that were confirmed. When we receive a new member, do we hug them or do we welcome them in from a safe distance, however far away that may be. When we worship God in song, do we sing traditional hymns? Do we welcome in some contemporary music? For those that don't like new music, our new hymnals are full of new hymns that we do not know. Do we ever tap our toes, do we ever clap? Do we ever blurt out Amen so loud you startle your neighbor?

I bring up these points because all of these are things that everyone in the congregation should be able to discuss freely and share their thoughts about. We cannot effectively make decisions on Session without knowing how you feel.
