



Hola from Peru! Studying and traveling down here has been an amazing experience! It hasn't been like anything I could have expected, and I

have continuously been surprised.

When I first arrived here in September, I was pleasantly surprised to be in such a modern city because I wasn't expecting to have all of the modern amenities that I am blessed to have at home. Initially, I thought it would be a completely different world down here, but come to find out it's actually very similar.

Peru is a very diverse country. I have been able to trek through the Andes, visit Incan ruins, visit Afroperuvian communities in the coastal desert, as well as communities in the Amazon Rainforest, and currently I live in the Andes mountains and shadow in a hospital to see first hand what Peruvian healthcare is like. The way of life is extremely different in each region here with regard to traditions and customs. The one thing I found that each of these communities have in common is that they all share similar values. Hard work. family, and faith are extremely important in every community here. I find it ironic that I will be coming home soon for Christmas, and no matter how culturally different things are here with all of the different kinds of people, they're similar in so many ways. The people here are full of joy, love, and hope. When I first arrived, I expected those that have less to not be as content with their lives or constantly be wishing for more; however, it's quite the opposite. The citizens here seem to be genuinely happy and enjoy their day to day lives because they've never known anything different. At home, it feels like everyone is wishing or wanting for more and never content, here they seem happy.

There are some families here that have mansions in the cities, and there are others that have small houses made of tarps and sheets of metal with a tiny plot of land in the provincias. If you compare these people, they obviously have differences in material worth. Yet, those that are "less fortunate" aren't really less fortunate aside from material things. I put this in quotations because I'm not a big fan of the phrase. Less fortunate to me means a lack of resources like safe water, a roof over their head, or food on their table. But, less fortunate meaning less amenities and unnecessary things that we're used to having, I don't consider "less fortunate". I think if people have everything they need, they're as fortunate as anybody else. I've grown up with the opinion that not having money or not owning many things doesn't mean you aren't blessed with what God gave you. This has been reiterated with the people that I have encountered

here because they are so thankful and grateful for what they do have. This perspective has shown me that less may actually be more. These people share the hope and love of Christmas without all the fanfare and big wish lists for more. These are things that will stick with me.

As I have three weeks left here in Peru, it's been fun to look back on the things I have experienced. I am extremely grateful to have been afforded this opportunity, and I want to thank my church family again for the continuous love and support you have shown me.
