

<u>AS THIS ELDER SEES IT</u> . . .

Hello to all my loved ones here at Bethel, if you're reading this and don't attend Bethel I love you also. God is moving in GREAT ways here at Bethel and around our great nation. You have the NFL coming together in prayer for a player collapsing on the field, they kneeled in unity for God instead of protest. Super Bowl 57 just played, had two openly professing Christian quarterbacks, AWESOME. The prayer revival happening in Kentucky, that has spread to other college campuses. If you are not seeing God's breath entering the lungs of his people, you might want to come out of the cave you are in.

I want to speak on the growth here at your beloved Bethel. A year ago our pews were collecting dust with an average of 35-40 people, but a small season of a year this has doubled. Blessings are being bestowed upon us. We are working in tandem with one another, we are loving one another, and we are headed in the right direction, towards God!!! I want to specifically speak about one particular thing happening at Bethel. No, it's not about our transition for a change, but about the Bible study Bethel has been hosting for a year and a half. This Bible study has grown so much that we have moved locations three times within the church to accommodate the amount of people showing up, the excitement, the interaction, the compilation of different churches and denominations, all ages coming together for one purpose. To grow both mentally and spiritually with better understanding of God and his word.

I personally have grown more in this short period than I can honestly say I have in my entire life. The first year we did the outline 52 Weeks with Jesus, if you missed it, go online and order it. You'll discover things in a different things about love through Jesus and with Jesus. We are in the Engaging God's Word book of Acts now, it's a thirty week course. Another spectacular outline to study on the first days of the church. As of now, Acts 3 has been my favorite, most humbling, and the most thought inspiring passage thus far.

Peter and John Heal a Man at the gate of the House of God

3 Peter and john were going to the house of God about three o'clock. It was the time for prayer. **2** Each day a certain man was carried to the Beautiful Gate of the house of God. This man had never been able to walk. He was there begging for money from those who were going in. **3** He asked Peter and John for money when he saw them going in. **4** Peter and John looked at him. Then Peter said, "Look at us!" **5** The man who could not walked looked at them. He thought he would get something from them. **6** Peter said, "I have no money, but what I have I will give you! In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!". (continues)

7 Peter took the man by the right hand and lifted him up. At once his feet and the bones in his legs became strong. **8** He jumped up on his feet and walked. Then he went into the house of God with them. He gave thanks to God as he walked.

9 All the people saw him walking and giving thanks to God. **10** They knew it was the man who had been sitting and begging at the Beautiful Gate. They were surprised he was walking **11** The man who was healed held on to Peter and John. All the people who were surprised gathered together around them in a place called Solomon's Porch.

The passage hits a home-run in so many ways, on how the world really is and honestly how I've been in life. I don't want to lump everyone in a bubble of my realization on this passage, but you may have been here also. So let's break it down, the way this Elder sees it. I think we all have been the beggar prior to finding God. Maybe not in the sense of begging for money, begging for things of flesh. Begging for things that are a temporary fix to a long term problem, to either the temporary void where God should be, or the absence of God all together.

You see this man was carried to the beautiful gate and dropped to beg for money but they never took him further. Perhaps this could represent stages in your journey in life. It could be that you are looking for help and need help. Another, the people that are offering assistance will not take you where you need to be. The man has never been able to walk, metaphorically I didn't know how to walk either until I found Jesus. Believe me I still stumble and fall and crawl. Also in verse 2, people are just passing him by, maybe giving him pocket change. This reminds me of the guy that's panhandling, we drive by, give the change in the cup holder, knowing, we still have the big bills in our wallets for ourselves. Remember these people were going to temple and the big money meant social status in the offering plate. What good does status do you when you cheat a person in need?

Now in verses 3-6 this is the start of the good stuff. The beggar finally asked the right two people for money, Peter and John. They gave him what money can't buy, something more precious than gold, the one thing that is priceless. The gift of God, the gift of Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. The man could walk, the man ran with the spirit, he shared his gift. Do you remember your personal Peter and John, who taught you to walk, who taught you not to beg, who shared their gift with you, and transitioned you from a lame beggar and you walked through the beautiful gate into the kingdom? Have you been and are you now acting like Peter and John? Could it be you who are passing by the people that need help? Could it be you still give cup holder money in hopes of making the trumpet sound louder. These are the questions I ask myself now. My greatest growth in God I truly owe to Bethel, the people of Bethel, the community involvement and the Bible study.

Verses 9-11 the beggar gives thanks to God. The beggar used to be lame outside the gate. People are surprised he is walking. People recognize the change in him. People gather around him now for he is on the other side of the gate, the beautiful gate. In the end, metaphorically speaking, this passage is about you, us.

That's how this Elder sees it.


