

LOVING YOUR NEIGHBOR

July, the month of parades, picnics and fireworks. The month where these events may have you reflecting on events of almost 250 years ago that set into motion these happenings. Events that laid the foundation of the most prosperous country in modern history. Have you ever considered the significance of historical events and what comes of them, whether they lead to great countries or fade into the dustbin of minor happenings? Many times either path could have been the fate of George Washington and the Continental Army which were often near defeat or for one reason or another were going to be unable to continue the struggle for independence.

In the Bethel Bible study of the book of Acts, I find myself considering the similarities of the founding of the United States and the founding of the early Church. In addition to the privations and death and injury risked by those that served in the Continental Army in the fight for independence, the founders that signed their names to the Declaration of Independence were also in danger of being caught and punished. As Benjamin Frank-

lin famously put it, "We must, indeed, all hang together or, most assuredly, we shall all hang separately".

And as the book of Acts documents in the establishment of the early church there were persecutions and executions, most famously the stoning death of Stephen, approved and supervised by the Pharisee Saul. After Saul's conversion on the Damascus Road, he himself suffers numerous beatings and risk of death in his travels to evangelize and encourage the young Christian church then known as The Way.

They seized Paul and dragged him out of the temple, and at once the gates were shut. And as they were seeking to kill him, word came to the tribune of the cohort that all Jerusalem was in c onfusion. He at once took soldiers and centurions and ran down to them. And when they saw the tribune and the soldiers, they stopped beating Paul.

Acts 21:31-32

But the difference in these two historical events is that the experiment in self-governance in North America had a real chance of failure, where Christ's new church would not, and could not, have failed.

As the previous Bible study, 52 Weeks With Jesus, study wrapped up everyone shared a lesson that had been impactful for them. There were two different lessons on loving your neighbor and that was my takeaway as I found my commute over Afton Mountain tests this daily with loving my commuting neighbors.

"The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." MARK 12:31

The study of Acts has taken a deep dive into the early Church and its people and has expanded the bigger picture of it in ways that I had not grasped from just pieces of scripture on Sunday or even reading through it

myself. It has given me new respect for the apostle Paul, that he preached from the Old Testament alone as he was laying the groundwork for the New Testament, that even though he had not walked with Jesus, his faith and ministry rivaled the disciples who had.

But rather than any one lesson standing out from the study of Acts, I am encouraged to grow spiritually in discipleship and equipped with increased knowledge and understanding to reach out more with the message of Christ's salvation

And the Lord said to Paul one night in a vision, "Do not be afraid, but go on speaking and do not be silent, for I am with you, and no one will attack you to harm you, for I have many in this city who are my people." Acts 18:9-10

And if the message is not accepted, Paul has shown that I can have a clear conscious as long as I have tried. I can shake out my garments and consider myself innocent.

When Silas and Timothy arrived from Macedonia, Paul was occupied with the word, testifying to the Jews that the Christ was Jesus. And when they opposed and reviled him, he shook out his garments and said to them, "Your blood be on your own heads!

I am innocent. Acts 18:5-6


General Business:
